Data for Context & Perspective

 Research states that 60 – 70% of people with severe mental illness want to work competitive jobs

• National & State Average = 7 - 11%

• MO IPS sites range from 26% - 71%

• MO mean = 40% (as of 4^{th} Quarter 2015)

People served in Missouri $\circ 2009 = 423$ $\circ 2015 = 826$ People working in Missouri $\circ 2009 = 30 \%$ $\circ 2015 = 38\%$ Number of Sites (IPS Fidelity) $\circ 2009 = 6$ 02015 = 13

IPS, what is it?

- A standardized approach to supported employment for people with long-term impairments due to severe mental illness*
- Evidence-based supported employment is also known as individual placement and support (IPS).

 * all principles are applicable for people with co-occurring MI & Substance Use

Who gets IPS ? Where do they get it?

- IPS is ONLY provided to individuals with serious & persistent mental illness who are coded MSD (Most Significantly Disabled) by VR and who qualify to receive either CPR or CSTAR services.
- ONLY for individuals receiving services from community mental health providers with Community Rehab Provider (CRP) agreements to provide IPS.
 Additional funding provided by Medicaid & DMH with specific documentation.

Mental Health & VR missions

- IPS is a dynamic partnership between the two agencies.
- Missions of each agency focus on helping people recover from their disability & for some that means helping people get jobs and IPS is shown to increase employment outcomes.
