

Unmet Funding Needs

 According to MoDOT's 2019 Citizen's Guide to Transportation Funding in Missouri, there is \$80 million in unfunded, highpriority multimodal transportation needs annually.

What is Coordination?



Coordination is achieved when "multiple entities work together in delivering one or more components of a transportation service"

- National Center for Mobility Management

Levels of Integration



Communication

Sharing information acting independently, but establishing a regular forum for communication as opportunities arise.

Coordination

Acting jointly (on an informal basis) — working together on selected functions by non-binding action.

Collaboration

Acting jointly (on a formal basis) — working together on selected functions by binding action (e.g. a memoranda of understanding).

Consolidation

Total Integration —
merging selected (or all)
functions by mutual
consent and legal
transfer to a single legal
entity.



- According to the Federal Transit Administration, coordinated transportation can:
 - Improve overall mobility within a community
 - Particularly when human service agencies are each providing transportation for their own clients
 - Eliminate inefficiencies that result from a multiplicity of providers
 - Help stretch the limited (and often insufficient) funding and personnel resources of these agencies through greater efficiency
 - Lead to significant reductions of operating costs (per trip) for transportation providers

"In communities where coordination is made a priority, citizens benefit from more extensive service, lower costs, and easier access to transportation."

The LINC

 Support from Lincoln County has allowed for demand response public transportation since the early 2000s along with providing transportation to and from medical appointments in St. Charles & St. Louis for \$10 roundtrip.


Tri-County Transit

- Investing SB40 funds from Camden County
 Developmental Disability Resources into the local
 OATS system allowed for the creation of a deviated
 fixed-route public transit service for the Lake area.
 - û 270% increase in ridership on OATS in Camden County between 2016 and 2019
 - 1 8% increase in sales tax revenue in the city of Lake Ozark





Accessible Programs

- Paratransit ADA and non-ADA
 - Eligibility how determined and the types
 - Rules of the road what to expect, what not to expect
