Beginning late spring and throughout the summer, the Division has been working on Phase 2: Design, Build, and Configuration with FEI Systems. Detailed requirement sessions have been held on the Individualized Support Plan, Quality Assurance, Consumer Referral, and Billing and Claims. Additional sessions were conducted to continue to refine requirements for the new case management system.

In addition, the Division is working with FEI on an updated detailed project schedule with additional tasks and revised start and end dates. The proposed re-baselined project schedule has a go-live date of October 2022 for a pilot, November 2022 for full go-live, and project end date of September 2023 (to be inclusive of stabilization and CMS certification of the system post go-live). This project is now expected to last a total of 38 months from initiation to close-out.
