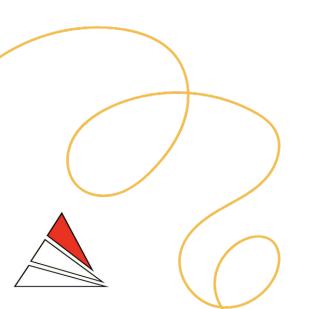

#### Brief Definition of Communication

What is Communication and Why is it Important?

- De finition
  - Communication is a process that involves sending and receiving messages through verbal and non-verbal methods.
  - Communication is a two-way means of communicating information in the form of thoughts, opinions, and ideas between two or more individuals with the purpose of building an understanding





#### Brief Definition of Communication

What is Communication and Why is it Important?

- Communication is essential to our daily lives.
- Any task or activity we do that involves another individual requires us to communicate with them in some way.
- It helps us build relationships, access things in our environments, relay important information, understand the world around us and to be understood by others.

#### Brief Definition of Communication

What is Communication and Why is it Important?

- It is essential to communicate with people you support to help them meet their needs and improve their quality of life.
- Challenging behaviors often occur when early attempts at communication either are not understood or are ignored by others.
  - The challenging behaviors often lead to limitations and restrictions being put in place for the individual



## Simple Communication VS Actual Treatment

The goal of the information contained in this module is to increase your understanding of communication and to work on developing communication/interactions while you wait for professional help such as a speech/language assessments and/or an assistive technology assessment

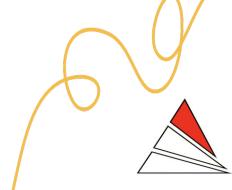

#### BASIC ASSESSMENT

- · Ask yourself or others who know the individual
  - What are the individuals hearing, listening and visual skills?
  - Does the individual have control of their arms and hands?
  - What visual cues might the individual present to show communication intent?
  - How or where can you document the individual's intent to communicate?

#### BASIC ASSESSMENT

- Ask yourself or others who know the individual
  - Does the individual have social interactions?
  - Are there noises or vocalizations that are consistent?
  - How does the individual express emotions?
  - What is the individual's ability for motor imitation?



- BASIC ASSESSMENT
  - Ask yourself or others who know the individual
    - What does the individual recognize
      - Can the individual recognize real object replicas or isolated photos as stand-ins for the real things



- BASIC ASSESSMENT
  - Ask yourself or others who know the individual
    - Can the individual follow directions (1-step, 2-step)?
    - Understand social cues, gestures, pointing, pictures?



- BASIC ASSESSMENT
  - Can the individual make requests?
    - Are requests honored?
    - Are there ways to honor the requests consistently?
    - What are the barriers?



- The answers to these questions are all elements that need to be documented in the individuals plan
  - These are essential for everyone to understand the communication intent of the individual

# Developing a Simple Exchange System

This module is not a replacement for clinical services

- DEVELOPING A SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - What is the Purpose of an Exchange System?
    - A way for individuals to communicate without relying on speech.
    - The aim is to teach intentional, functional communication and to allow users to communicate their wants and needs.







- DEVELOPING A SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - What is an exchange system?
    - It is communication that uses visual symbols to teach the learner to communicate with anyone
    - To communicate, individuals use cards with pictures, symbols, words or photographs to ask for things, comment on things or answer questions



- DEVELOPING A SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Who can implement an exchange system?
    - Almost anyone can implement an exchange systems and training is important to everyone.



- DEVELOPING A SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Why use an exchange system?
    - Helps develop intentional communication
    - Reduces negative or challenging behaviors caused by frustration
    - There is in the moment prompting of exchanges
    - There is increased choice-making opportunities



- DEVELOPING A SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Why use an exchange system?
    - Increases opportunities for interaction and learning
    - Develops social skills and ability to build meaningful relationships
    - May lead to or improve spoken language skills



• DEVELOPING A SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM

Gives the individual a "voice"



- DEVELOPING A SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Understanding the Order of Learning
    - Real object or replica
    - Photo
    - Colored Line Drawing
    - B/W Line Drawing
    - Word



- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - When Using a Photo/Picture
    - Select durable materials heavy card stock, lamination, binder, file box to hold items or picture cards
    - Select clear pictures that
      - Prominently feature the item/action that it represent
      - Resemble as closely (as much as possible) the actual environment

#### • DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM

- Picture cards should be easily grasped/selected by the person who will be using it
- Consider the use of something like Velcro to hold choices of multiple exchange cards in close proximity (for choosing) and for organization (keep things together so they don't get lost)

- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - IN THE BEGINNING
  - Keep it simple
    - 1 item and then add to it as skills develop
  - It might be a simple snack request that can be honored despite multiple requests
  - Small sizes and broken into smaller pieces
    - Example
      - Choice is carrots to start with pieces of a carrot or carrot match sticks
      - Choice is pretzels then give pretzel sticks or pieces of pretzel
         Not intended to replace clinical services

DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM

Honor the request when made







- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - ALWAYS MAKE THE EXPERIANCE POSITIVE
    - LOOK FOR SMALL APPROXIMATIONS OF THE BEHAVIOR AND PAY IT OFF

#### • DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM

- Teaching the Basic Exchange
  - Choose a highly motivating item
  - Place item in clear sight/view of the individual
  - Modelhow the item can be received by exchanging the card
  - Prompt the person to exchange the card (may need to physically move person through motion)
  - Once the card is exchanged, provide the motivating item
  - Repeat (a lot)
  - Slowly fade out the prompts to use the exchange



- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Arrange for Practice Using the System
      - Find a space that is relatively quiet and clear of distraction for practicing
      - Create a consistent and predictable routine for when practice will occur
      - Introduce person to the materials
      - Teach the basic exchange
      - Start with one card and slowly expand the vocabulary

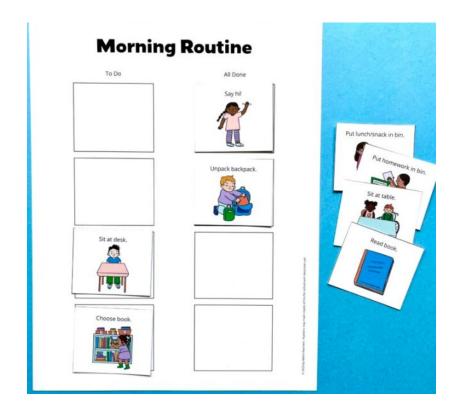


- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Arranged practice using system
      - Practice having individual point to/give card and then providing that thing
      - Prompt use of board/cards when choices/communication is programed to happen, increasing choice-making





• DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM







- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Prompt Use of the System in the Moment
      - Make sure the communication cards are always within reach of individual
        - Put on a ring
        - Have it on a wrist band
        - Have it velcroed on a tag on you
      - ALWAYS have access

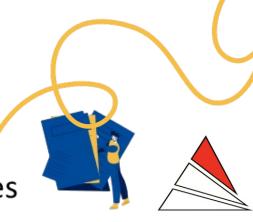
DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM





- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Prompt Use of the System in the Moment
      - HONOR the request
      - Allow the person the opportunity to independently use communication cards to indicate choices

- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Prompt Use of the System in the Moment
      - Provide lots of enthusiastic recognition when the person independently utilizes the communication cards



- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Prompt Use of the System in the Moment
      - If the individual doesn't use communication cards for learned actions/items
        - Prompt the use of the picture exchange prior to granting access to action/item
        - Physically prompting the use of the card may be necessary



- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Increase Choice-Making Opportunities
      - Once the individual has learned multiple picture cards and how to successfully exchange them then
      - Utilize the cards to present choices among learned actions/items
      - This can be done by presenting a binder with cards velcroed on or arranging cards on a flat table
      - Allow the individual to choose by pointing, grabbing, or otherwise indicating which is the preferred item/action

- DEVELOP SIMPLE EXCHANGE SYSTEM
  - Teaching the Basic Exchange
    - Stay with the system until additional supports are obtained
      - Formal SLP
      - Trained communication provider
      - Device obtained and trained
